FREE College CLASSES!

Western Wyoming Community College

College classes for students 16 and over at RHS or COOP high schools are free. The tuition (cost of the class), fees (internet or lab costs), and books are all paid for by CCHEC.

**Concurrent Enrollment:** These college classes are taught by a college approved high school teacher during the school day. For example: CNA with Mrs. James or Woodworking with Mr. Jackson

**Dual Enrollment:** Students take on-site and online classes directly from WWCC at CCHEC, often times during the school day. For example: General Psychology, PSYC 1000 or English Composition, ENGL 1010.
